Pet Loss Education

During their fourth semester, our Bachelor of Mortuary Science (BMS) students took the inaugural offering of the Alternative Forms of Disposition course which included a three-week lab learning how to operate the Pet-400 Alkaline Hydrolysis machine.

Our students were grateful to learn from three deceased pets donated into our care. As their final project, Mrs. Lee tasked them with creating a ceremony to honor these pets and their contribution to student learning. The creativity of this cohort went beyond all expectations. They took it upon themselves to craft a ceremony based upon a culmination of learning by combining elements from several courses, including Certified Celebrant Training, Pet Loss, and from Alternative Forms of Disposition, using art as a form of memorialization.

The students eagerly organized a multi-part Celebrant Service that began with a "Pouring Ceremony" led by CCMS student and artist Kelly Wilson. During the pouring ceremony, a small portion of the pets remains were carefully added to each student and instructor's individual painted canvases.

The second part of the ceremony was for hallowing or making sacred the space the pets are stored while in our care. The celebrant service was read by CCMS student Lauren Hill, and poems and other readings read by CCMS students Laken Dye and Hannah Drugmand.

Finally, the students created a larger canvas with each of their handprints added in the same paint used for the pouring ceremony. The individual memorial canvases and the larger canvas with student handprints, along with printed copies of the celebrant service and poems, will eventually be hung in the room the students had hallowed through ceremony. We

are so proud of the reverence, gratitude, empathy, and creativity that went into this project. It was work well done!

Ohio Laws & Rules - Cremation & Death Care, Ethics in Death Care, and Preneed Ethics

Ohio Laws & Rules (2 hours) This four hour program is delivered at/by Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science, 645 W. North Bend Rd., Cincinnati, Ohio 45224 and is intended to provide licensed funeral directors, embalmers, and crematory operators an overview of recent changes and proposed changes to Ohio Laws and Rules for death care practitioners and businesses. Registrants will be provided resources to navigate the Ohio Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors website to keep them current with Laws and Rules which directly impact them as a practitioner, as well as their business and employer.

The objective of this program is to help practitioners understand and embrace the function and efforts of the state regulatory agency.

Preneed Ethics (1 hour) Attendees will also educate funeral homes about preneed reporting requirements, and the ARPPS reporting system, and Preneed Recovery Fund.

The presentation includes an overview of Ohio Administrative Rules about ARPPS published by the Ohio Board.

Ethics (1 hour) We will also discuss ethics, along with the responsibility and challenges we face as death care professionals. The course will challenge registrants to understand the differences between ethics, morals, and laws. We will engage in discussion and provide resources on Model Ethics Policies in the workplace, the Ohio Ethics Commission, and the Order of the Golden Rule Ethics Model. The objective is to engage registrants in dialogue about ethical dilemmas they have experienced, or could experience, that may result in liability.

“The Lung Wait” - Organ Donation and Arlington National Cemetery: Restoring Honor

This two-hour continuing education program will be hosted at Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science, 645 W. North Bend Rd., Cincinnati, OH 45224. Mr. Lechner discusses his time as a trade embalmer and the feelings of resentment embalmers have about remains that have undergone organ and tissue donation. He goes on to explain how that perspective all changed when his son needed a double lung transplant. Now, when the former trade embalmers view remain that have donated organs and/or tissue, he views the individual as a hero. His story is compelling and supports funeral directors encouraging organ and tissue donation.

The slide presentation is followed by a 38-minute, emotional documentary film about the long time his son spent on the waiting list. During the period of waiting his physical health continued to deteriorate and he continued to lose weight which almost excluded him from getting a transplant. The documentary finishes with his successful transplant, marriage, becoming a father of two, and continued good health.

Mr. Lechner will also provide insight into the nation's largest federal cemetery from the perspective of the former Superintendent. Content includes operations processes to facilitate 3.1 million visitors per year while simultaneously conducting over 8,000 funerals with varying degrees of military honors. A 20-minute video produced by the Association of the United States Army depicts the 2010 scandal which prompted the Millennium Project to create process improvements and redefined governance to this national shrine.

This 6-hour continuing education and Master Certification Program delivered at Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science, 645 W. North Bend Rd., Cincinnati, Ohio 45224 is a one-day seminar intended to deliver the most advanced and thorough training for funeral director and embalming "Masters". To achieve excellence as a Master Funeral Director and/or Master Embalmer, death care professionals must be intentionally invested in their role as a teacher and mentor and must desire to develop a well-rounded understanding and knowledge of required legal, ethical, and regulatory components, interpersonal communication skills, understanding of the apprentice's expanded educational concepts and a desire to help mold the candidates slated to carry on existing and new traditions as the future of the death care profession.

Qualified candidates for Ohio Funeral Director and/or Embalmer "Master", he/she must hold an active Ohio funeral director or embalmer license for a period of no less than five years and be in good standing with the Ohio Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors. The candidate must complete a one-day, six-hour face-to-face (or live interactive webinar in accordance with Ohio's amended pandemic hardship rule) board approved training course. Master certification is valid for five years from the date of training.

Training is delivered by Ohio Licensed Funeral Directors and Embalmers, Ohio laws, rules and regulations experts, and college educators specializing in death care and funeral service.


What's Happening at CCMS?


